



IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR ALABAMA

Grants to Alabama Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$10,237,857

Total Number of Awards – 41

Award Highlights:

- Professor Jennifer Feltman of the University of Alabama is using 3D modeling to discover what the Cathedral of Notre-Dame de Paris looked like in the 12th and 13th centuries. Analysis of the cathedral after the 2019 fire shows traces of different colors of paint that have worn away over the years but are now being virtually reproduced.
- Alabama State University is archiving historical records from the Alabama State Teachers Association and the Alabama Democratic Conference. The collections contain primary sources documenting the civil rights movement in Alabama.

NEH also provides annual funding to the [Alabama Humanities Alliance](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Alabama Humanities Alliance Highlights:

- AHA's new Healing History Initiative helps Alabamians examine their shared history and get to know one another better across divisions. Through the initiative, AHA aims to foster trust and empathy through mutually respectful discussions about our shared past, present, and future.
- A grant from AHA supported the second season of Alabama Folk, a podcast by the Alabama Folklife Association. The podcast features interviews with artists and craftspeople who carry on traditions passed down through generations in a variety of urban and rural communities across Alabama.
